We have started a second half of Autumn term and we are very pleased to see all our children back and looking very smart.

We are happy to introduce our new attendance mascot "Attendance Annie" who is encouraging daily attendance and punctuality of all pupils.

We are also having a colouring competition, which we are encouraging all children to take part in.



Maths: Next week we will be learning about addition. We will look at joining numbers up to 20.

Things to do at home:

Ask children to make 2 groups of toys and ask how many toys are all together.

English: Your children will probably have told you that they have to go to another class for their English. This is because we have started teaching English through the Read Write Inc programme. We have adopted this additional approach on top of our normal approaches. The children will use adjectives to describe characters (Superheroes) using their special attributes. They will use onomatopoeia within a comic. They will be encouraged to use phonics strategies to spell words that describe sounds. They will be using capital letters to start their sentences and end their sentences with a full stop. They will be encouraged to use finger spaces to separate words.

Things to do at home

. Ask children to make a sound of an event.

Example:

What sound does jumping in a puddle make?

History

In History, the children are continuing to learn about significant people in History and their contribution to society.

Science

Next week we will learning about different materials. We will look at their characteristics and how they can be used to make different objects.
