Maths

For our Maths focus next week, the children will be exploring division by grouping. They will be grouping numbers or objects equally between 2, 5 or 10 parts. Division is the opposite of multiplying. When we know a multiplication fact we can find a division fact. So $6 \times 2 = 12$ and $12 \div 2 = 6$.

How you can help at home:

Use everyday objects and get them to group them into equal parts.
