Year 1 Weekly Learning 1st May 2020

Ask an adult or your sister or brother to play a spelling game with you.

Example: Can you spell

The days of the week: Monday Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday.

What day is it today? What is the date today?

Ask an adult to tell you the day you were born on. Do they remember how much you weighed?

Are there any famous people born on the same date as you? *Use Google to find out.*

Building a shelter

My son wants to build a shelter in the garden, but he does not know which material would make the best shelter. Help him. Tell him why you think that material would make the best shelter. Types of materials:



Here is a rectangle. Write as many facts about it. You may think of vertices (corners) edges (sides), lines of symmetry (lines that cut it up into 2 equal parts).



Write as many sentences as you can about this animal. You can give it any name you want.

Make sure you use an adjective and a conjunction.

Example. This is Maga a **huge** Grizzly bear. He has a lot of **long brown** hair **and** a **black large** nose.

Four in a row game: A game for 2 people.


How to play: -Player 1 should choose 2 numbers from the boxes above, **subtract** them and find the answer on the grid and cover it with their counter or colour it in with their chosen colour. (If the answer appears more than once on the grid, you can decide which one to colour in, not all of them at once). Player 2 takes their turn and does the same.

Continue taking turns. The winner is the person first to cover 4 squares, diagonally, vertically or horizontally. Have fun!

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Snakes and Ladders



You will need...

- The Snakes and Ladders Board Game board
- A dice
- A counter per player

How to play...

1. Players take it in turns to roll the dice. The player with the highest number goes first, the person with the second highest goes second and so on.
2. The player moves the counter the number of spaces shown on the dice.
3. If a player lands on a snake's head, the player's counter slides down to the square at the snake's tail.
4. If a player lands on the bottom of a ladder, the player's counter climbs up to the square at the top of the ladder.
5. The first player to reach the finish is the winner.
