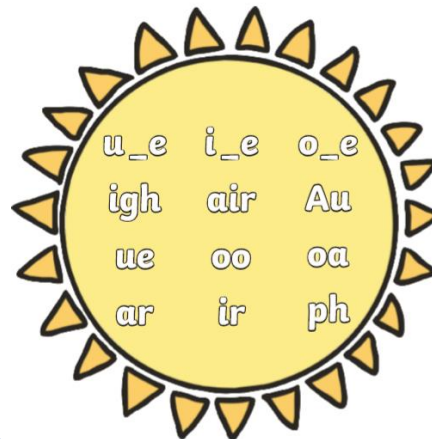

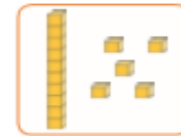

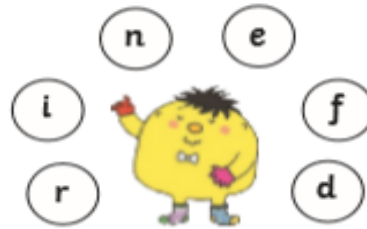

- lay eggs.
- warm-blooded.

AMPHIBIANS

- live on land & in water.
- cold-blooded.
- lay eggs.
- moist skin.
- webbed feet.

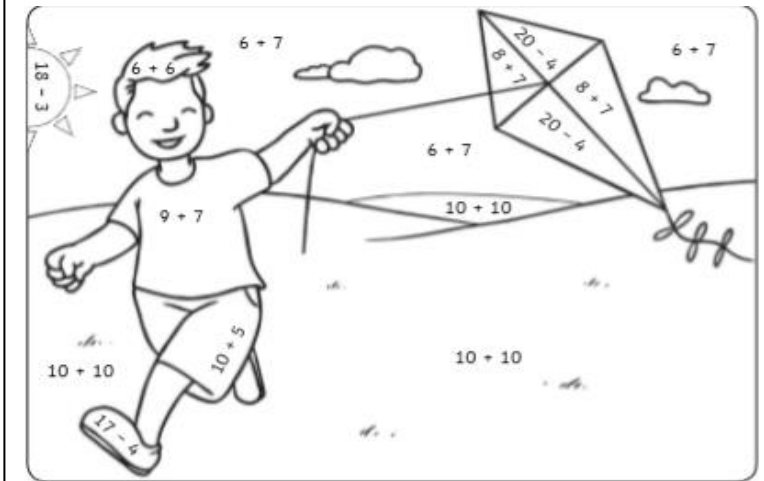
FISH

- breathe underwater using gills.
- have scales and fins.
- cold-blooded.
- lay eggs.

- Invertebrates (No Backbone)
- Have ~~egg~~ exo-skeleton
- Segmented body
- Lay eggs
