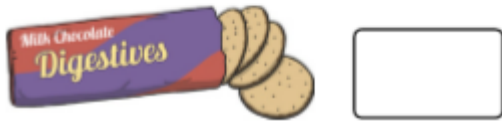

Grow a bean in a bag

Method

1. Wet the paper towel and put it inside the bag.
2. Put the bean on the paper towel and seal the bag.
3. Tape the bag to a sunny window.
4. The seed needs warmth to germinate and the sun should provide that. Plus the light will enable everyone to see the germinating seed better. It should take 3-5 days for the seed to germinate. Keep the paper towel moist, you may need to add a bit of water to it if it dries out. After 2 weeks, your bean can be planted in the soil or in a pot.

Sunflower Fork Printing

You will need:

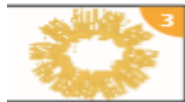
- a piece of white card (A4 or A3)
- green paint
- a fork
- yellow paint
- brown paint
- a paint brush
- water pot
- a tooth brush



Get a piece of card and place it in front of you in portrait.



Carefully paint the underneath of a fork with yellow paint using a brush.



Pressing down with the fork, repeat creating a circular pattern leaving a space in the middle. You may need to apply more paint to your fork and go over the circle.



Wash your brush in the water pot and dip it on to the green paint. Paint a stem from the flower head down to the bottom of the page. Paint a leaf on to each side too.



Wash your brush using the water pot and dip it into brown paint. Apply the brown paint to the tooth brush.



Carefully print in the circle inside the yellow fork printing using the toothbrush. You may need to keep applying brown paint to the toothbrush.

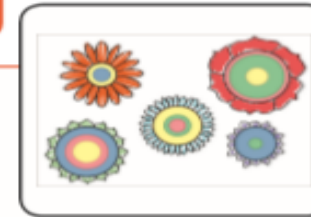
Top Tip:

You could choose to create a different flower using the same printing method. You could try daffodils or tulips.

Mixed Media Flowers

You will need:

- A4 or A3 card
- felt tip pens
- coloured card
- circle templates (pre-cut for the children to use)



Choose a piece of card for your background.



Using the circle templates, draw around each one on the coloured card and cut them out. Each flower will need 2 or 3 circles of different sizes and colours.



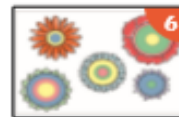
Stick the circles on top of one another, putting the largest at the bottom.



Stick the groups of circles on the background piece of card. Remember to spread them around.



Using a black pen, draw around the edge of each large circle and then draw the petals around. You can do this in a variety of ways.



Decorate the flowers however you like using your black pen or other pens. You may wish to use lines or dots.

Top Tip:

Add leaves onto your drawing.
