Hard working Humans





We use this topic to support teaching in all areas of the curriculum.

In this topic the children will be exploring:

- The history of the Windrush Generation (History).
- Listen to range to music and learn new dance styles such as tap dancing, ballet and modern (Music).
- Sketch a picture of a significant individual (Art).

This term these are the subjects that are taught within the school day







English

We will be reading the story 'Malala's Magic Pencil' by Malala Yousafzai.

Character description

The children will be learning the features of a character description ; how to use adjectives effectively, creating expanded noun phrases and writing in the third person.

This term we will be following 'No nonsense spelling' and learning new strategies to spell more High frequency and Common exception words.

Our reading focus is using the text to find the answer to literal questions.





Multiplication, division and

We will be exploring different methods of solving multiplication and division.

The children will use their knowledge of number to recall doubles to 20, use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables, including recognising odd & even numbers. They will also learn to calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division writing them using the appropriate signs.





History

The History of the Windrush Generation

We will be exploring and discussing the significant individuals who made changes to our country after World War II.

During this topic the children will be going on a trip to the Windrush Legacy Association in Croydon to compare how people lived in the past to now. The children will also compare experiences of themselves or family members coming to England.



Art - Year 2 - Autumn 2

Children will using different materials, different types of paper and sizes of paper whilst learning how to draw from different angles.


<u>RE</u>

Physical Education (PE)



This half term the children will learn skills in -Throwing and Catching

- Controlled form
- Knowing positions

Children will learn how to:

- To show good levels of hand eye coordination when throwing/ catching.
- To have an understanding of different muscles in use when balancing different ways.
- To be able to show different types of movement to throw and catch.









This half term the focus is Christmas Music.

The children will learn-

- Identify and name instruments, how to play them tap/shake/scrape etc.
- Identify different types of musical instruments heard in Christmas music.
- To use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes



Computing

This half term the focus is – Online Safety

The children will discuss way they can how to help if someone is being bullied, know how to give and receive compliments and ways to accept that everyone is different.




Reading


The children reads with and adult x3 a week in a small group. In the groups they are taught to:


- Identify diagraphs/trigraphs within words.

- Practise, practise, practise!


<u>Maths</u>

- Helps their mental maths.




<u>Homework</u>
