<u>Literacy</u>

Books we will be sharing -

We will be exploring – retelling a story, using our sounds to write sentences, joining in with speech.

Phonics – Little Wandle Letters and Sounds



As we introduce a new phoneme, children learn to say the sound it makes and how to write the grapheme. Cards have a picture to help children remember the phoneme.







blending

- Oral blending
- Adult says each phoneme then child jumps in to blend.

- Teacher led and independent blending
- Adult uses letter cards to build words.

Decoding – read the sentences Prosody – read with expression Comprehension – answer a question



Maths

Children will build on the skills they have learned – counting, 1 more, 1 less and number bonds. We now move on to numbers to 10

Children will continue to build their skills to make friends and communicate with others and learn ways to resolve problems.
