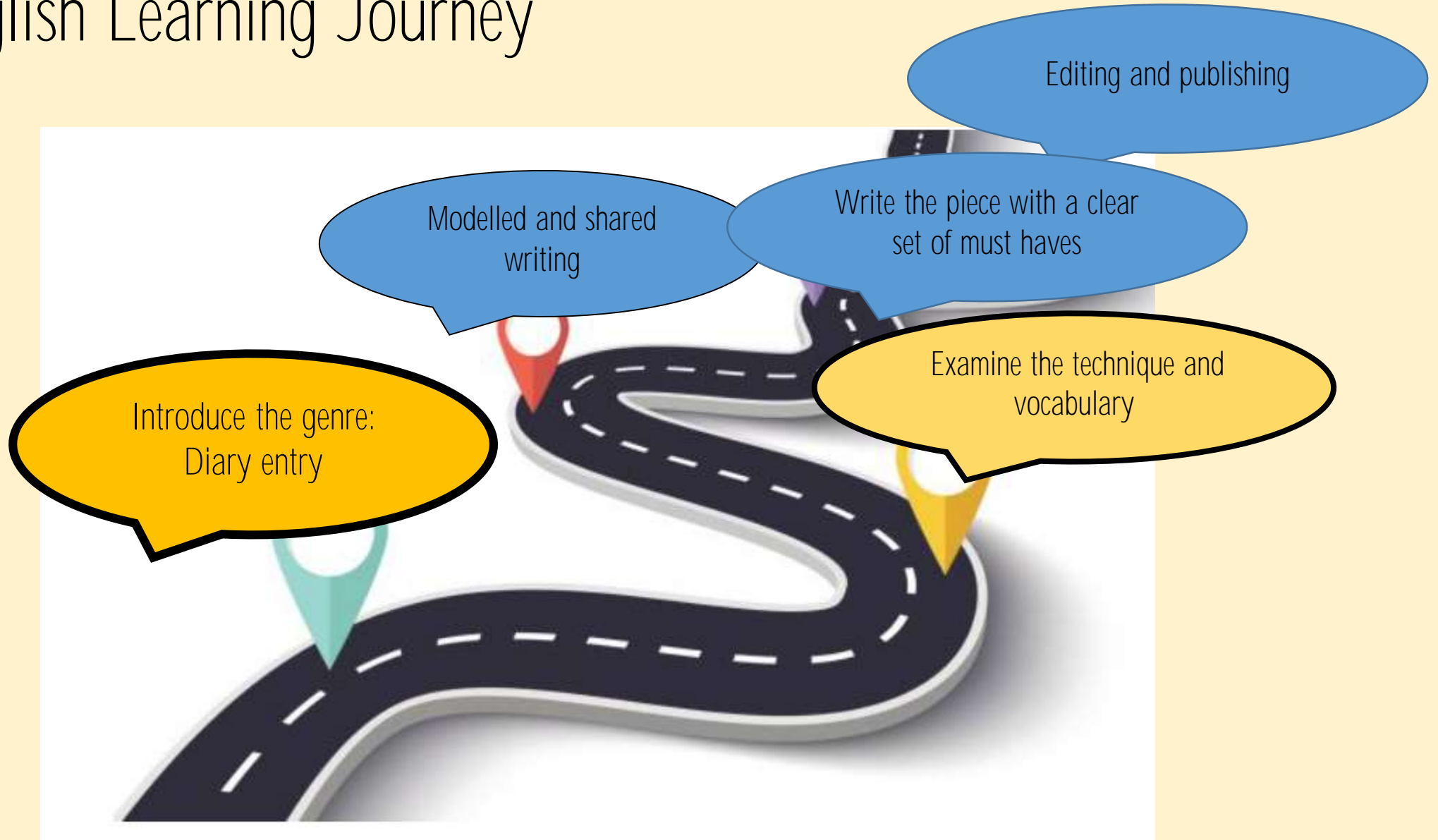

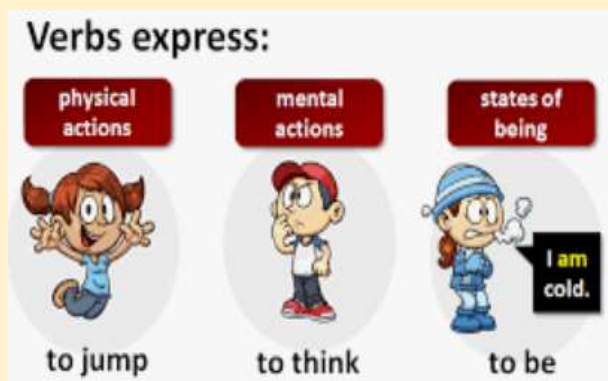

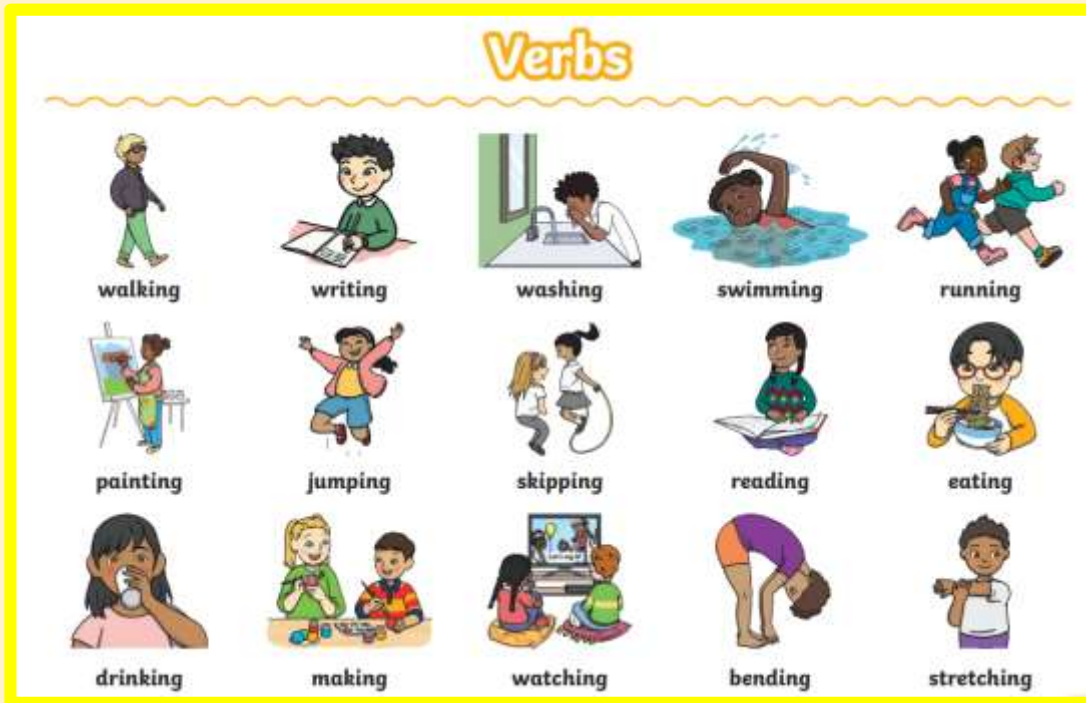

Statements are sentences that give you a fact, opinion or idea.



I cried a lot today.

They usually contain a verb.

They end with a full stop.

Partner 1 tell your partner a statement.

LQ: Can I understand what statements, questions and commands are ?

Questions are sentences that ask you something. They usually end with a question mark.



Can we go to the park?

This requires an answer

It will finish with a question mark.

Partner 2 ask your partner a question.

Commands are often urgent or angry, they can be short and contain an imperative verb (bossy verb).



Give me your tablet.
Get out!



Imperative verb

They can end with a full stop or exclamation mark depending on the tone of the sentence.

Partner 1 tell your partner a command.

An exclamation is used when someone is surprised.

What a spectacular trip!



It will end in an exclamation mark

*It will start with 'how' or 'what'.
It can sound like a question but it
isn't as it does not need an answer.*
