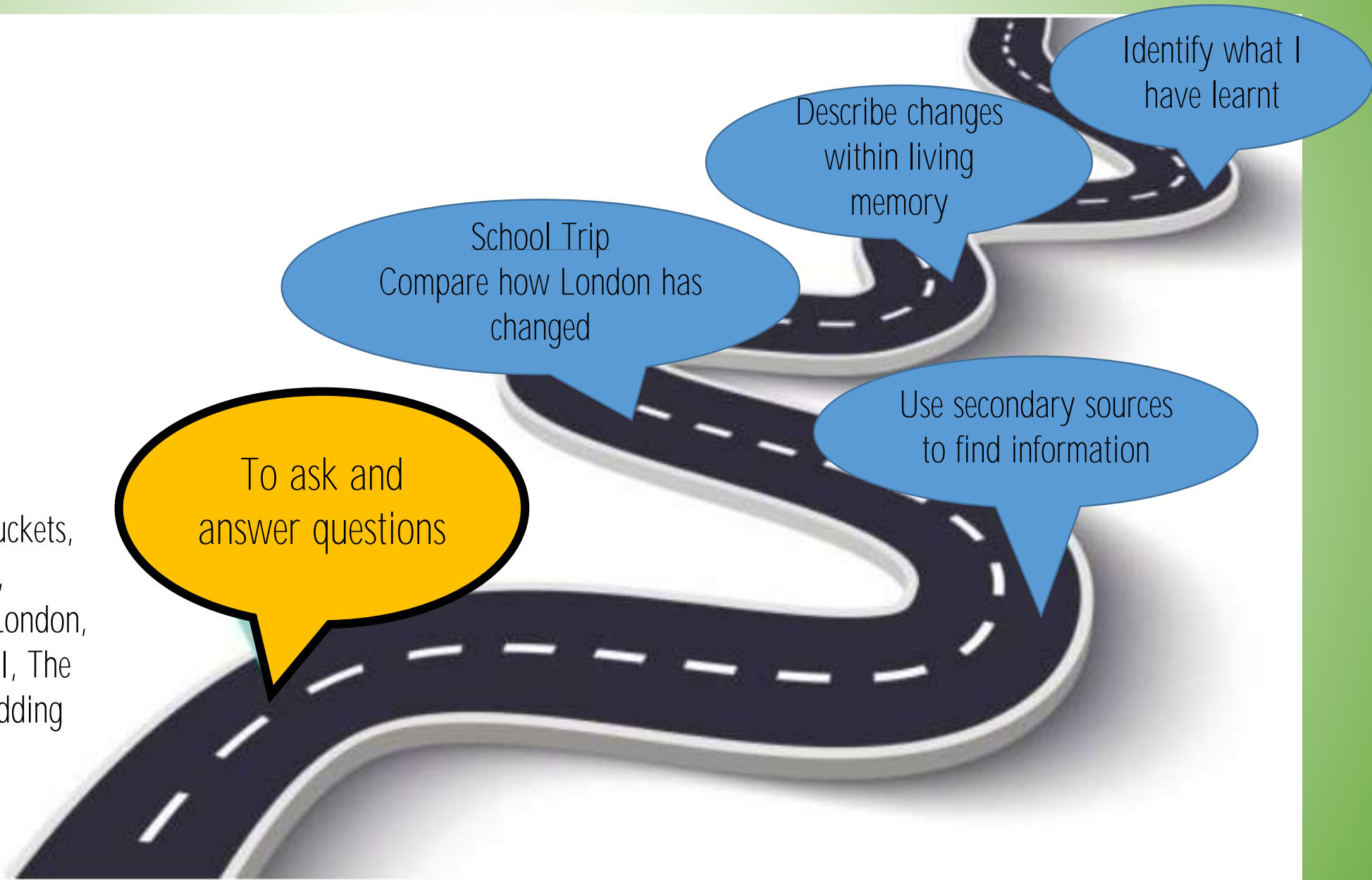

How do we use it?



Today we are going to use compasses.
A compass has four directions - north,
east, south and west.

The needle always points north,
so when that is lined up with the
map it is easy to see in which
direction things are.

LQ: Can I use a compass?

TPs – Where is north on the compass?



This is where north is on the compass. You can use this to work out where east, west and south is.

Using the compass, point to where east is, point to south. Stand up and turn facing west.
