

Birdseye view is the other name for aerial view, it is called this because it is the view from looking down from above.

#### TP- Why are maps are shown in aerial view?

Maps are shown in aerial view so that you are able to see the full layout of the area including key features of important places such as, hospitals, places of worships, shops, transport and roads. These features are usually shown as symbols on a map.








