

Banksy

A lot of Banksy's work is done using stencils. Banksy is very famous but nobody knows his true identity, as he keeps it a secret.



His work is often political or humorous. He uses art to expresses his own opinions.

Graffiti is characterised by colours, intricate patterns, and is typically used to convey a political or social message. This art style tends to feature loud, bold, **3D letters**.

Tag

A tag is the most basic type of graffiti *it's the artist's signature. It's usually* written in spray paint or marker pen.

The most important thing is to make it unique and use colours that you like.

This half term you will be creating your own tag using your nickname or initials.

In graffiti art, there are different styles that can be used to create a tag. Bubble writing Wild-style Bars







Remember, there are (almost) no rules! The letters can overlap, some parts might be broken up and letters can be positioned at different heights.

Adding colour is what makes the artwork stand out and to make it look 3D, artists leave highlights where the light would fall.




Graffiti artists sometimes use special letter characters.

Redraw the letters with a clean outline. Make sure you arrange them in a way that looks effective. You can turn the letters, write some lower than the others or make some smaller.


Add a 3D effect by adding a black area to the same two sides of each letter.



What might we find tricky when using Bars style writing? What can we do to make it easier for ourselves?








In your books have a go at creating different background styles.
