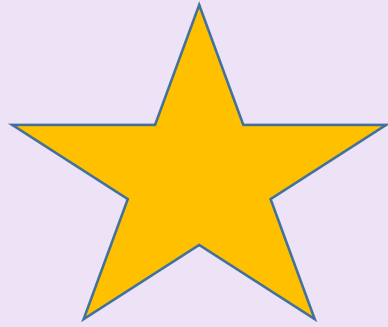

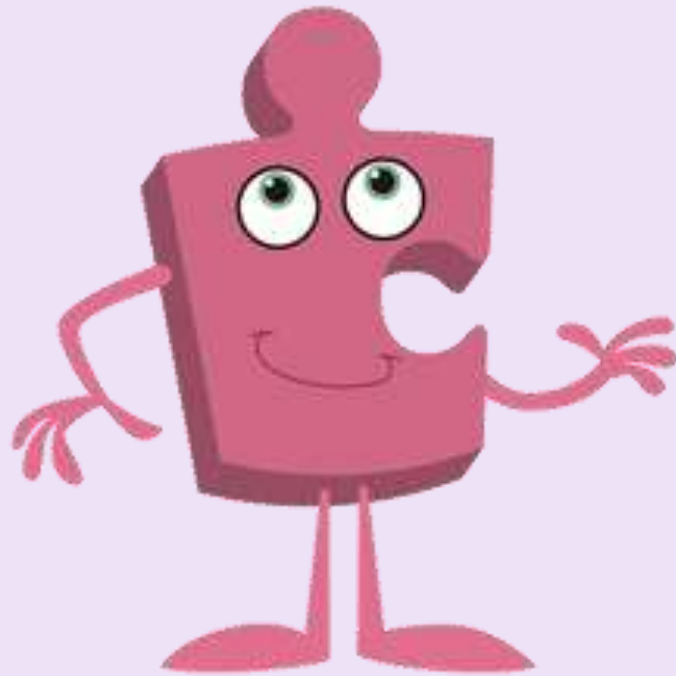

Is there a medicine that could help Jigsaw Jo? What sort of medicine?

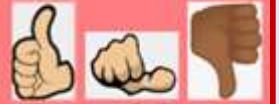
Will any of these medicines help Jo?

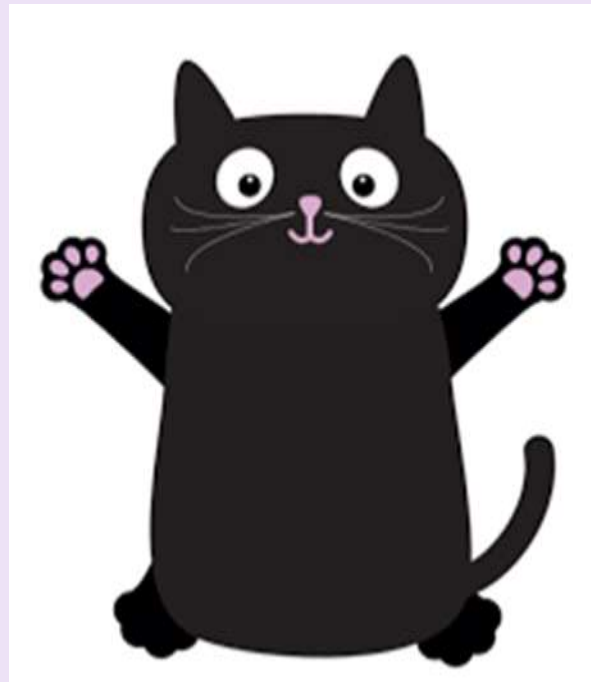
Self assessment

Do you understand the importance of using medicines safely?



- Children must never take medicine on their own as this could be very dangerous and harm their bodies.
- They must only take medicine when a trusted adult gives it to them.
- They must only take the dosage it says on the bottle/packet, NOT more.
- *They must NEVER take each other's medicine.*
- *Medicine must be kept in a locked cupboard out of children's reach at home.*
- There are lots of different ways we can try to help ourselves feel better, but sometimes medicine can help us get better.
