

Tag Style

In graffiti art, there are different styles that can be used to create a tag. Bubble writing



Graffiti is characterised by colours, intricate patterns, and is typically used to convey a political or social message. This art style tends to feature loud, bold, 3D letters.

Wild-style










With a black marker pen, copy one of your designs directly onto your A4 white card. Don't try to change the design now – instead stick to what worked the first time!


















Before you add colour, use a pencil or light colour to draw around the areas you will want to keep white as highlights. Add your choice of colour with a felt-tip pen.









Frame your work by drawing an outline around the letters. This will really make the tag stand out.


- Final Artwork

Add some different doodle style line drawings to each of the segments you have drawn behind your tag. These could be horizontal, spiral, wavy, vertical, diagonal, arched or zigzag.
