• Write an animal fact file.


<u>Phonics</u>


We follow the Little Wandle letters and sounds' programme.

Maths

In Maths this half term we will be focusing on:

Read with expression taking into account of the punctuation.





Science

- Name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals

They will decide on a goal and aim to achieve it.


<u>Art</u> This half terms topic is called **Cultural Patterns**
