Time conjunctions are words that help you to sequence events in the right order.

First	Next	Then	After that
Meanwhile	After a while	Eventually	Finally

Time conjunctions are words or phrases which are used to tell a reader when something is happening. We often use them in instructional writing and recounts. For example:

First I took an apple from the fruit bowl.








When writing a recount we are remembering events that have happened. They use a lot of verbs because things have been done or happened.

TP - What is a verb?

A verb is an action (doing) word.



What happens to the meaning of a word when -ed is added?

It shows the action is happening in the **past**.

This is called **past tense**.




