


Christians believe that Jesus is God's Son.

He taught people to forgive others and to honour God so they can enter God's kingdom.


He often taught by using parables, or short stories that illustrated his message.

When Jesus was an adult he started travelling and doing miracles.


He went to the party and turned water into the wine He fed 5000 people with 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish.


He walked on water.


