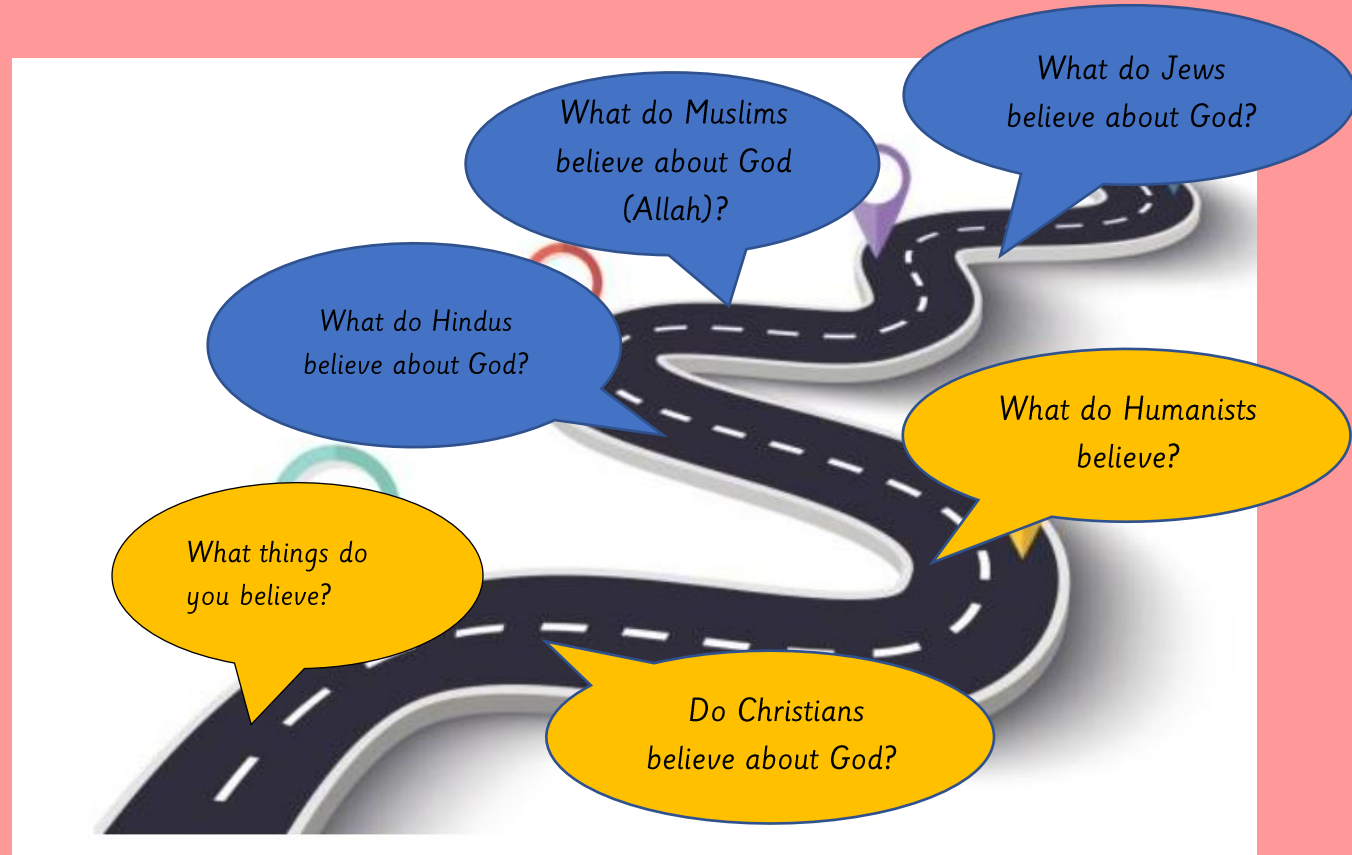

## LQ: What do Humanists believe about God?

### Steps to success

- *I know that most Humanists do not believe in a God (they are atheist).*
- *I know that Humanists do not believe in an afterlife (heaven).*

*We've been learning about religions and faiths which help guide people's morals.*

*Morals are ideas about what is right and wrong, like being kind, honest, and fair, which guide how you act and treat others. You learn morals from your family, friends, and school, and they help everyone live together peacefully.*

*You can learn morals from stories that teach lessons, but the best way to understand them is by seeing and doing them yourself, like helping others or being a good role model.*



*Humanists are people who only believe things they can find proof for.*



Many Humanists do not believe in any gods, because they do not see any proof. Humanism isn't a religion, but a world-view.

*Humanists believe that we only have one life, and must be kind to others.*



*They believe that humans can act morally without a God to guide them.*

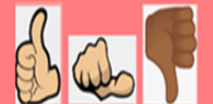
