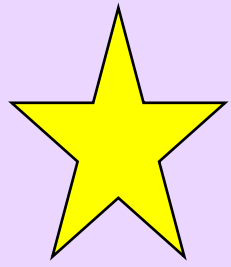

*Some: I can discuss how I feel about the artwork.*

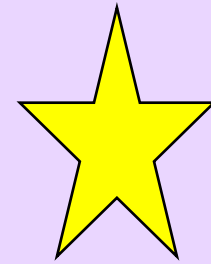

## TPs: What is a portrait?

A portrait is a picture of a person or a group of people. Images of faces are called portraits.



## TPs: What are facial features?

Facial features are the main parts on the front of the face.



Today we are going to look at abstract art and identify and discuss the features. Then we are going to make our own abstract portrait.

**Let's find out more about abstract art.**

Abstract art is a practise that does not have recognisable subject, it doesn't represent images of our everyday lives such as animals, objects, nature etc.

It has colours, lines and shapes, but they are not designed to represent living things or actual objects.



Abstract art can still express **emotions** and **feelings** by using **colours**, **lines** and **forms**.

**Form** is when objects are 3 dimensional (not flat) or have length, width and height.

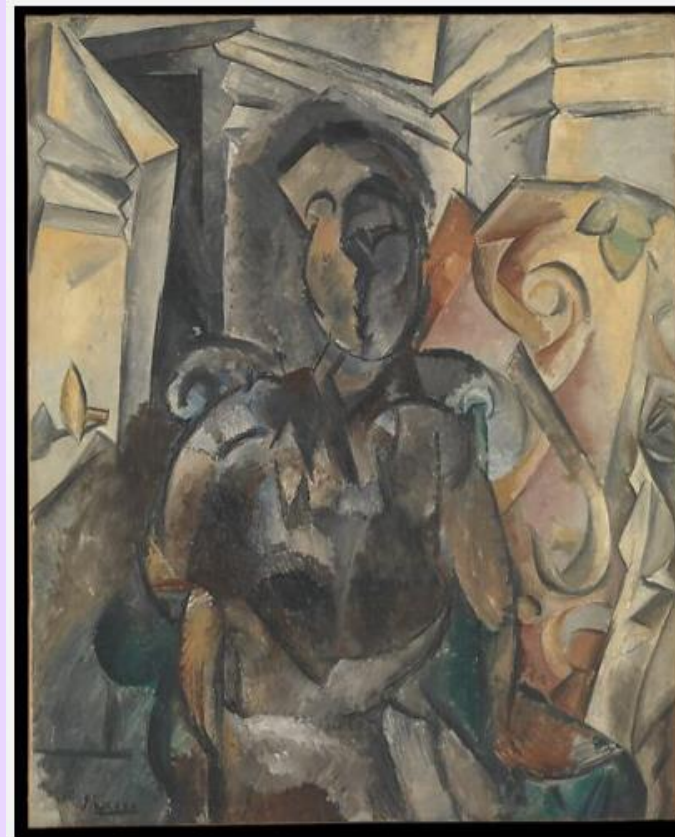
*We will be exploring and discussing abstract art by the artist Pablo Picasso. Pablo Picasso is a famous artist.*

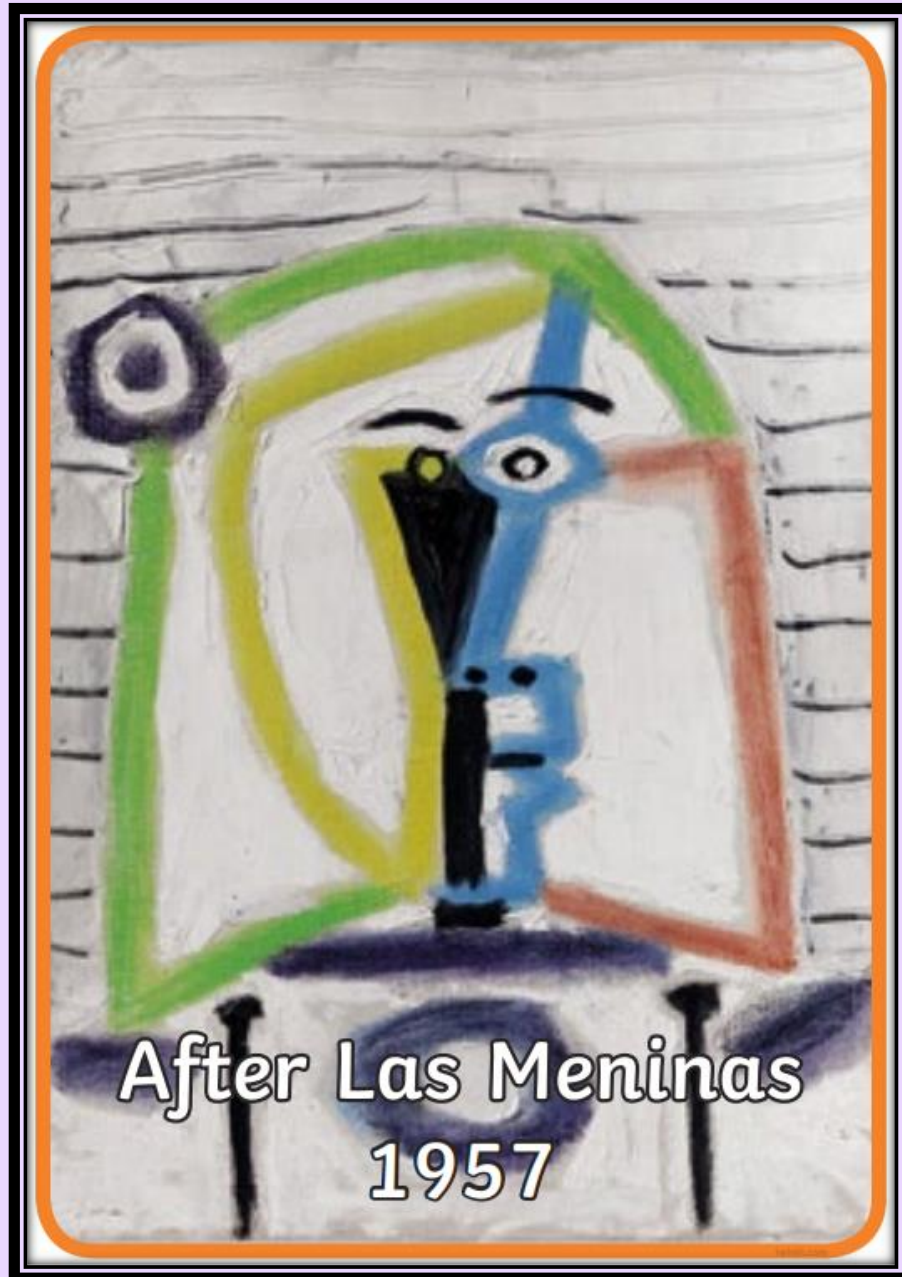

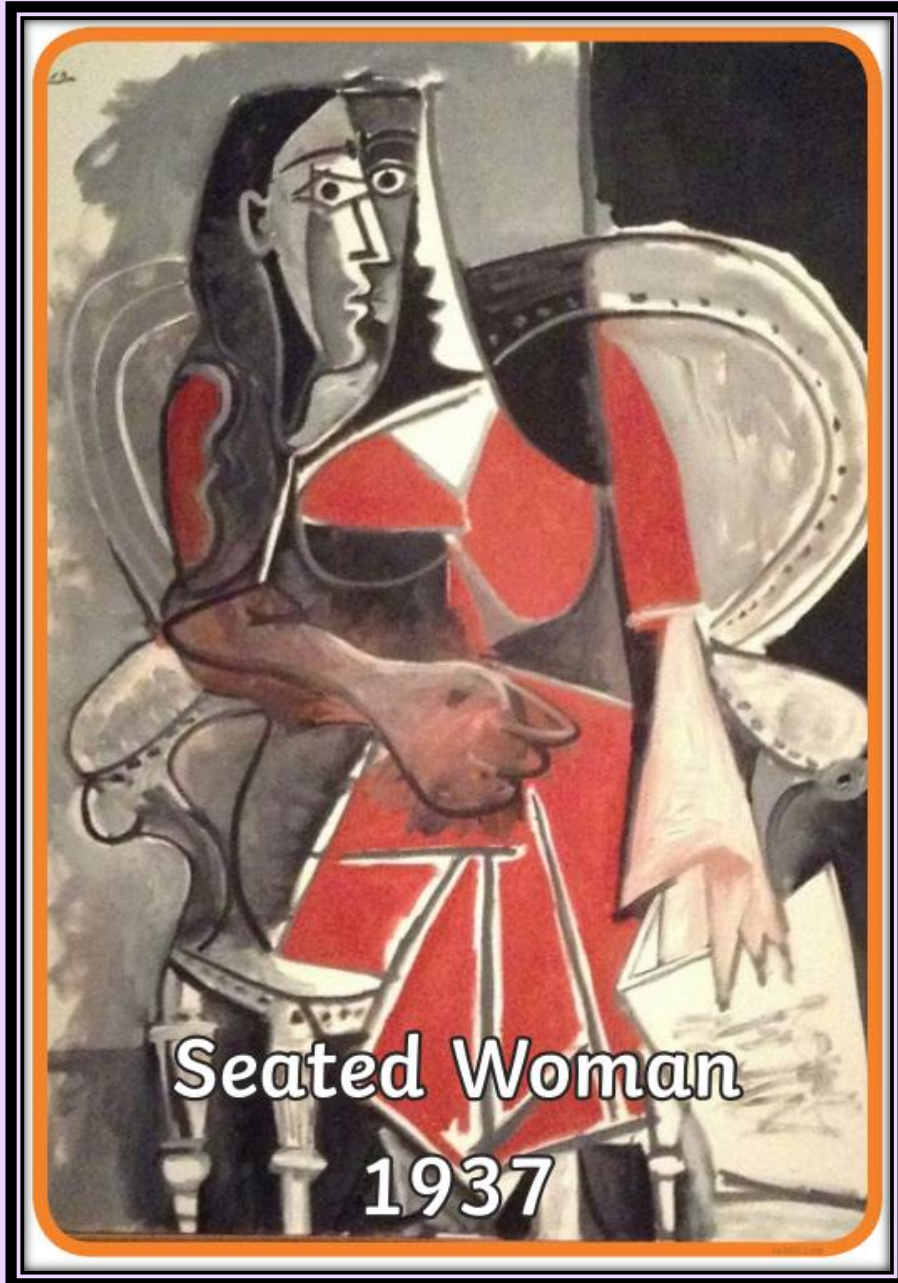
