Nelson Mandela

Nelson Mandela was born in South Africa, where Black people were treated very badly.

He campaigned for Black people to be treated equally, and was sent to prison for 27 years.

He was freed in 1990 and later he became the first black president of South Africa.

Mary Seacole

Mary Seacole was born in Jamaica in 1805.

She later travelled to London and asked the British government to make her a nurse in the Crimean War, which was being fought in Russia.

The government said no, but she travelled to Crimea anyway. During the war, she saved the lives of lots of soldiers.

Harriet Tubman

Harriet Tubman was born in 1822 in America.

She was enslaved, which meant she was “owned” by another person.

She escaped and went on help free 70 others with the help of the “Underground Railroad,” which was a group who freed slaves.

Later in life, she supported women’s right.

Rosa Parks

Rosa Parks was born in 1913 at a time when black people were treated very poorly compared to white people.

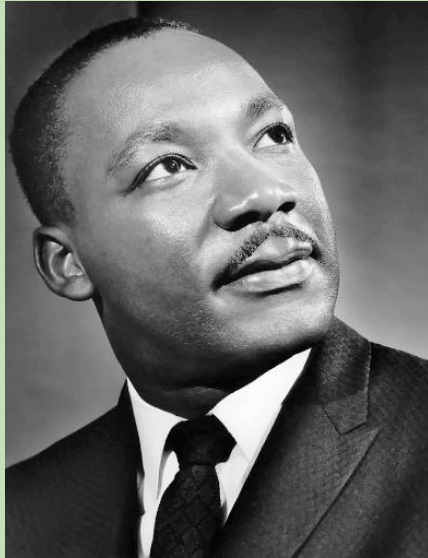
In 1955, she was taking the bus home from work.

The driver told her to move so that a white man could take her seat. She said no and refused until she was arrested.

After she was arrested, lots of people protested and refused to take the bus, so the bus company would run out of money.

Martin Luther King Jr. was born in 1929. When he was a child he had to go to a school for only black children, and the white boys in his neighbourhood bullied him.

He grew up to be a priest, and when Rosa Parks was arrested he encouraged people to not take the bus.

He was famous for his speeches, and organised lots of protests and was a major leader of the Civil Rights Movement.

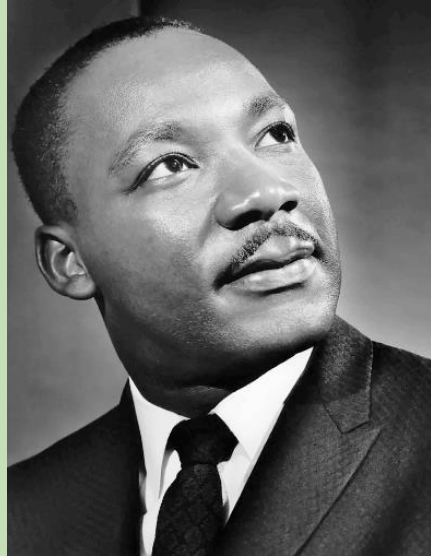

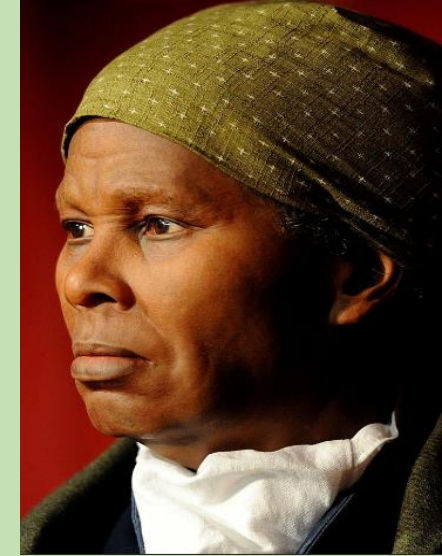

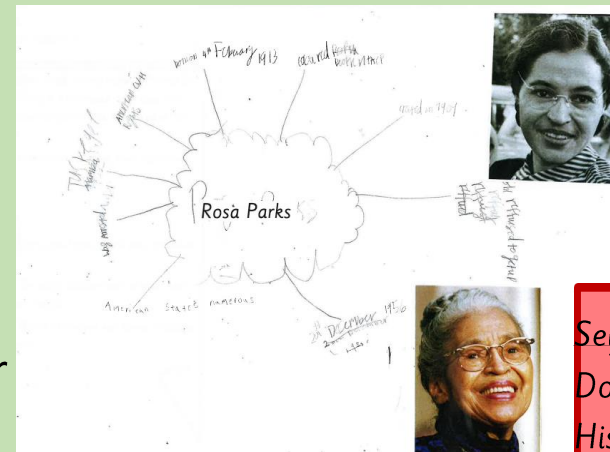
