Tag Style

In graffiti art, there are different styles that can be used to create a tag.

Bubble writing

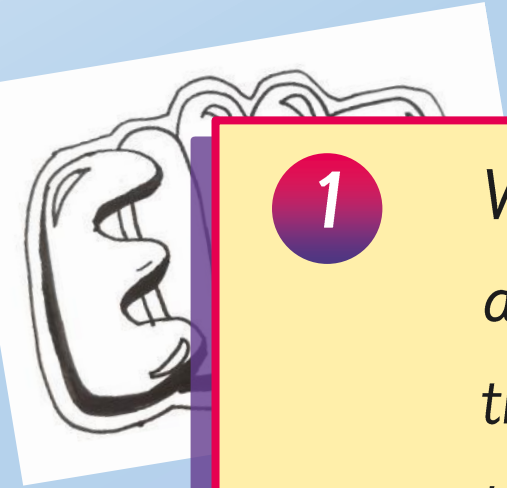


Graffiti is characterised by colours, patterns and often shows a political or social message. It usually has bold, 3D letters.

Final Artwork

1

With a black marker pen, copy one of your designs directly onto your A4 white card. Don't try to change the design now – instead stick to what worked the first time!



Final Artwork

2 Add a 3D effect by adding some black space.



Final Artwork

- 3 Before you add colour, use a pencil or light colour to draw around the areas you will want to keep white as highlights. Add your choice of colour with a felt-tip pen.



Final Artwork

- 4 Frame your work by drawing an outline around the letters. This will really make the tag stand out.



Final Artwork

- 6 Add some different doodle style line drawings to each of the segments you have drawn behind your tag. These could be horizontal, spiral, wavy, vertical, diagonal, arched or zigzag.
