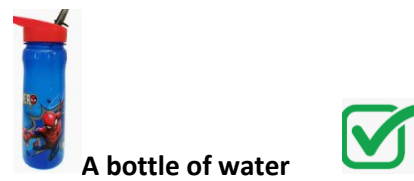
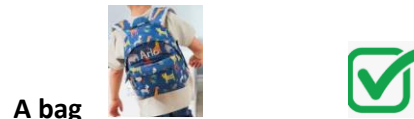

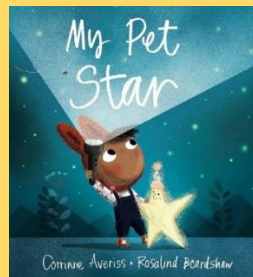
Do you know someone with a 3-year-old? Or does your child turn 3 this year?
